## **Unveiling of Sherwood Foresters Western Front Memorial** at Ypres in Belgium

The Parish Council, who in 2008 had made a donation towards the memorial, were invited to send a representative to Ypres for the unveiling of the memorial. In the Great War, from 1914 to 1918, 11,409 men of the Sherwood Foresters died on active service, the vast majority of them on the Western Front. Despite the counties of Nottinghamshire and Derbyshire having made this great sacrifice the Regiment was unique in having no lasting Memorial anywhere in France or Belgium.

In the aftermath of the war it was decided to commemorate the Fallen by the construction of a lanterne-des-mortes memorial in the shape of a lighthouse shining out over the Nottinghamshire-Derbyshire border from Crich Hill. At that time it was a wise decision as travel to Europe was expensive and difficult. Times have changed and many thousands of people now visit the


battlefield and cemeteries of the Western Front every year.

Parish Councillor Jim Spibey said he would like to attend the unveiling with his daughter, Elaine, and funded the whole trip himself. He and Elaine travelled to Brussels on the Eurostar on Friday, 23rd October, and this was the start of a very moving and memorable trip for both of them. That evening they attended a memorial service and wreath-laying in honour of the Sherwood Foresters at the Menin

Gate. The Mercian Band played, and a platoon of Belgian soldiers was in attendance. The Last Post was sounded by the local Fire Brigade, followed

by two minutes silence and then the sounding of Reveille.

Councillor Spibey said the unveiling of the memorial on Saturday, 24th October, at the Tyne Cot Commonwealth War Graves Commission Cemetery, which had been chosen because it was the largest War Graves Commission Cemetery in the World, was carried out by the Lord Lieutenants of Nottinghamshire and Derbyshire and was extremely well attended, many of the visitors having travelled from Nottinghamshire and Derbyshire. Again, Last Post and Reveille were sounded. The inscription on the memorial, which was made by R M H Eaton of Derbyshire, reads: 'In memory of over 11,000 all ranks of the Sherwood Foresters (Nottinghamshire and Derbyshire Regiment) who laid down their lives on the Western Front between 1914 and 1918. This memorial, in Derbyshire Stone, has been made possible by the generosity of the people of Nottinghamshire and Derbyshire'.



# **New Charity Shop opens in Somercotes**

Full-time worker Susan Curry and volunteers recently opened The Faso Charity Shop on Somercotes Hill, stocking everything from clothes to kitchenware and books to jewellery, to raise funds for a poverty-stricken African nation. The Faso Fund is a project which brings relief and resources to a cluster of villages to the east of Ouagadougou, the capital city of Burkina Faso. The project now incorporates an eight-acre site, a secondary, junior and infant schools, a baby orphanage and a maternity unit and a clinic. Susan, who visited Africa about four years ago, says "our money goes ten times further in Burkina Faso." The opening times for the shop are 9am to 5pm Monday to Friday and 9am to 4pm on Saturdays.

# TV ads to boost fostering and adoption

Derbyshire County Council is calling for foster carers and adoptive parents with a TV advertising campaign. The authority which currently looks after about 544 children – is running two different adverts throughout the day and evening on ITV1 Central. The adverts will appeal for people with room in their home and their lives to consider fostering or adopting

The campaign follows on from the success of adverts shown last November that led to 22 homes being found for local children. There are already about 400 foster carers providing stable and loving homes for children throughout Derbyshire for the county council. But more are needed to replace people who are retiring or moving out of the county so short and long-term foster care, and adoptive homes, can be offered for children

anywhere in Derbyshire.

Councillor Tracy Critchlow, Cabinet Member for Young People, said: "Caring for children is an incredibly important responsibility for us and we're always looking for foster carers and adoptive parents so we can match youngsters to the right homes. "Being a parent is one of the hardest jobs you can do but it is also one of the most rewarding, which is why many of our foster carers work with us for decades. "We offer generous rates and allowances and back carers all the way with support from social workers and other experienced foster parents in our team. "I hope these adverts will attract more people to come forward to foster or adopt." The TV adverts will show how the lives of a Mr Walsh, and Mr and Mrs Lewis have changed for the better as a result of caring for children.
