# **Derbyshire Ancestral Research Group**

# The Connections between St Thomas' Church and 'The War Horse'

WARRIOR was born in spring 1902 at Yafford, Isle of Wight. His mother was a beautiful thoroughbred named Cinderella and the stallion an exceptionally bright chestnut name Straybit. It was the exploits of this brave horse and his exceptional brave rider during World War 1 that were the inspiration for the book WAR HORSE by Michael Morpurago, which was made into the film of the same name.

JOHN EDWARD BERNARD 'JACK' SEELY was born on 31st March 1868, at Brookhill Hall, Pinxton. He was the son of Sir CHARLES SEELY OWNER OF Babington Colliery. benefactor of St Thomas' Church and of the community, building both schools and the houses on Nottingham Road, Somercotes, known as Seely Terrace. His wife EMILY. Jack's mother is commemorated on the pulpit in the Church. JACK moved to Brook, near General J. E. B. Seely on Warrior painted by Sir Alfred Munnings Mottistone, Isle of Wight where he grew up, who became a remarkable man.

JACK was educated at Harrow and Cambridge becoming lifelong friends with Winston Churchill, a favourite of QUEEN VICTORIA who gave a dinner in his honour before he

When WW1 broke out Jack and his horse WARRIOR left England on 11th August 1914 on a boat to LeHarve. The exploits of JACK and WARRIOR became the stuff of legend and he was a tremendous character, a born leader of men and brave beyond words.

WARRIOR died at Easter 1941 and had the distinction of being the only animal ever to have an obituary in the Times newspaper.

In 1927 JACK's uncle Lieut, Colonel F. E. SEELY unveiled the War Memorial outside St Thomas' Church

The Vicar of St Thomas' between 1944 and 1948 was the Rev. ROBERT JOSCELYN BOWYER. He left Somercotes for St Luke's, Derby and later became Rector of Brook with Mottistone, Isle of Wight, living there for the rest of his life with his wife ELIZABETH and is buried in Mottistone Churchyard.

Local musician John Tamms, who resided at Muchram wrote two pieces of music for

# Somercotes St Thomas Brownies

On Thursday, 16th October 2014, the Somercotes Brownies celebrated 50 years. The Brownies, was set up on 14th October 1964, by Barbara Osborne, becoming the first Somercotes St Thomas Brownies. Initially the Brownies used the Salvation Army building on Sleetmoor Lane, and then later moving to the nearby Church Hall. Since Barbara started the Brownies in 1964 there has only been three Brown Owls, Barbara 1964 – 1982; Gill Manning (Davis) 1982 – 1997 and Izzy (Isobel) Clarke 1997 to date. All three ladies were present for the 50 year celebrations and despite her age Barbara is still an active member of the Brownies, and long may it continue. Barbara still has the subs books, from the outset that showed the names and subs paid by the Brownies.

Somercotes Local History Society presented a WW1 Exhibition for the Brownies on 6th November 2014, at the Village Hall so that young people were given an insight into the loss of life and commitment of so many during the 4 years of war that devastated Britain.

The Somercotes area has seen a vast amount of changes in the last 130 years, yet one name remains a constant part of the local scene. Bailey & Sons Limited, Printers (Somercotes oldest business). Baileys has now passed through five generations of the same family. Christopher Brandon, the current owner. "William Bailey, the founder of the Company moved to Somercotes in the 1870's and after working in the mines he started the business full-time in 1881. A much respected man, he worked many years establishing the business before passing it on to his sons, William and Thomas. William had no children; Thomas had three, Frederick, George, Evelyn. Christopher Brandon took over the business in 1991 from Frederick's son Gordon".

Bailey's have been at their present site in Langley Avenue since 1914, many local people have been unaware of the terrific amount of work created from their unassuming premises. Their reputation for poster printing is known throughout the U.K. industry.

### Tarlton's Boot Store, Nottingham Road, Somercotes

Arthur Tarlton (great Uncle to Elsie) founded the shop in 1902. Arthur Tarlton's nephew (also Arthur) made the cycling overshoes for the Bronze Medal winning British cycling team, at the 1928 Olympics.





Amber Valley residents will benefit from extended free parking in Council car parks, after 4pm (before 10am Heanor). Every household will be issued with an annual parking permit (included with Annual Tax Return sent out in January).

For a £2 fee residents will also be able to upgrade to an enhanced permit for free parking on Sunday. Over 60's will have the addition benefit of free parking from 2pm, on Tuesdays and Thursdays.

In addition the Council has extended the Christmas free parking period to 27th December to support local trades and enable residents the benefit of free parking on the traditional first day of the sales.
