Somercotes Parish Hall, next to St. Thomas Church on Nottingham Road at Somercotes, has recently had new flooring laid in the foyer and the main hall. The stage has also acquired a new look with non-slip flooring and modern stage curtains. The main hall is spacious and a well-stocked bar is available for parties, at no extra cost. There is a well-equipped kitchen with a microwave and a double-oven gas cooker. The stage is spacious enough for live bands and for disco equipment. There is wheelchair access and a disabled toilet.

There is also another room for hire, known as the lounge, for smaller group activities, or as an extra room where more space is needed for larger parties. The Parish Hall is used by many local organisations for various events and activities, such as yoga, painting classes, craft clubs, keep fit etc., but is available most weekends for parties and concerts.



1917 **August 10th Alfreton and Belper Journal**

WELL CHOSEN WORDS FROM LEABROOKS

(An advert for Doan's backache and kidney pills)

On July 28th, 1913, Mr J Herbert of Leabrooks, near the railway crossing near Alfreton said: "I have been plagued a good deal with sharp, stabbing pains in my back and hips. I am inclined to think they were due to lumbago. They would strike me through so suddenly when I stooped or when I tried to rise from a chair. There were also urinary troubles. January 2nd Alfreton and Belper Journal

The Christmas handicap in connection with the Somercotes Institute concluded its final stages on Saturday evening when Mr J.BROWN won first prize, 4s and a special proze given by MR F.E.SEELY, MR H.HORSELY second prize, 3s and a special prize, a couple of ducks given by MR J MERRIMAN. MRTRILEY won third prize 2s, and special prize a couple of fowls given by MR T WILLGOOSE, MR A DAYKIN won the fourth prize Is and special proze a stillton cheese given by MR W ABBOTT, MR J SLACK for the fifth proze gained two dozen bottles of stout given by MR F HOPKINSON, MR J MERRIMAN, MR W RILEY AND MRW TOWSON each won a couple of rabbits and MRR SEVERN a pork pie.

August 14th 1914 Alfreton and Belper Journal

ALARMING TRAP ACCIDENT

On Thursday afternoon week, MRS NAYLOR wife of JOHN NAYLOR landlord of the Rifle Volunteer Inn on Birchwood Lane Somercotes, met with an accident when driving to South Normanton. The horse shied and ran away until its progress was stopped by a gate at the bottom of Birchwood Lane. When about 100 yards from the gate MRS NAYLOR jumped from the trap and was rendered unconscious. The servant who was at the time in the trap obtained assistance and conveyed MRS NAYLOR to her home. Medical aid was summoned and it was found that MRS NAYLOR had sustained serious injuries to her head

A Walk Around Teversal Park

Alan Rowe, Walks Co-ordinator of the Somercotes Walking Group, has provided this piece on a walk which took place during December 2010.

"Our members assembled at the "Toolbox" on Somercotes Market Place at 10 am to travel to Teversal on two mini-buses.

It was a bright, cold day for our walk round Teversal Park. Snow was still on the ground and the sun shone low in the magnificent mackerel sky. We followed the bridle path from the Visitor Centre to the monument at Silverhill. The bronze sculpture of a miner is in tribute to the former mining community and is situated at the highest point of Nottinghamshire. Hardwick Hall can be seen in the distance

Continuing our walk around the old colliery site (which is mainly planted with conifer trees), we made our way back to the Visitor Centre for refreshments, the total distance walked being about 3 miles. This is one of many varied and interesting walks that we at Somercotes Walking Group undertake every Thursday morning. New members are always welcome to join us.

Walks for March 2011 include a 3 mile walk from Crays Hill to Sleetmoor Wood, a 2.75 mile walk from Sleetmoor Wood to Alfreton Park, and Bus Trips including King's Mill to Sutton Lawn – a 3 mile circular walk. Posters listing walks for each month are displayed in local shops and the Parish Hall.


Appointment of Clerk to the Council
