

Each year your Council makes budget provision for grant aid to voluntary bodies for specific projects or items of equipment to continue their operation for the benefit of local people. The grant is to foster and encourage local clubs, groups and organisations in the Parish. Any Club, Society or organisation that is based in the Parish Council or provides a service for residents in the Parish can apply. So far in this financial year a total sum of £ 3950 has been made in grant awards. 1932 March 31st

THOMAS SHARPE, miner of Birchwood had to pay 4 shillings for cycling on the wrong side of the road.

1932 May 5th

58 members of the Mothers Union enjoyed a LMS excursion to Messrs CADBURYS works at Bournville.

1932 July 31st

Stating that the Magistrates considered him to be a menace to society and that he ought to be dealt with rather severely MR J G HANCOCK presiding at the Sirehall, Nottingham, sentenced to a months imprisonment LESLIE EDGINGTON TERRY, 29, of The Firs, Charles St, Leabrooks for obtaining 2s by false pretences. He was dressed in the uniform of a Boy Scout and had asked for the money to get some dinner. Inspector Brooks said he could not say anything in TERRYS favour and there had been many complaints about him & this sort of thing was common practice.

1932 Sept 23rd

The inaugural meeting of SOMERCOTES DEBATING SOCIETY was held on Friday evening in the boy's school; MR E A HILL was elected President, MR H HAGUE secretary & MR W HAYWOOD, MR G MINNS & MR H SANSOM to the committee. The first debate is "Should Capital Punishment be

1933 March 2nd

The ceremonial opening of SDOMERCOTES SENIOR COUNCIL SCHOOL took place on Saturday afternoon will long be remembered as being coincident with the worst snow blizzard experienced in 40 years. The total cost of the building was £22,686.

We don't want nuisance motorbikes and inconsiderate motorists who park vehicles, which cause obstruction! Your Parish Council has brought issues relating to nuisance motorbikes and motorists who park

their vehicles on pavements causing obstructions to the attention of the Police Safer

And following a community panel meeting, which took place on Wednesday, July 29 where

residents voiced concerns about a number of issues including nuisance motorbikes, problem

parking and speeding vehicles, Safer Neighbourhood Officers in Somercotes and Riddings

Officers from the area's team, which covers Somercotes, Swanwick, Ironville, Riddings, Leabrooks

The team have joined forces with colleagues from nearby Safer Neighbourhood areas to launch

They will be stepping up patrols at key times in local problem hot spots including the areas of Pye Bridge, the upper field and waste ground around Amber Valley Rugby Club and Wimsey Way in

Officers will be speaking to riders found to be causing a nuisance, giving advice about the

community issue and the law, as well as issuing Section 59 warnings where appropriate and seizing

Team members are also working to tackle nuisance parking across the area. They will be speaking

to motorists who park their vehicles on pavements causing obstructions for pedestrians,

wheelchair users and pushchairs, as well as on local roads, causing issues for emergency vehicles

and public transport. They will be issuing on-the-spot fines and fixed penalty notices where
