Minutes of the Ordinary Meeting of Somercotes Parish Council held at 6:30 pm on Friday 15th January 2016 in the Village Hall, Nottingham Road, Somercotes

(ii) Register of Members Interest: As a matter of good governance and best practice, members are reminded that they have a duty to keep registration forms up to date annually or as and when changes to any of their registered interests occur. Noted by members.

6/2016: Public Speaking – (30 Minutes)

The Chairman welcomed all members to the first meeting of 2016 and wished all a Happpy New Year.

(a) Police representation: PCSO R Plant- reported an increase in burglaries in January, this is usual after the Xmas period. Discussion took place on vehicle break-ins on the Industrial Estate and thefts of fuel. PCSO Plant and Cllr P Smith stressed the importance of ensuring that these crimes are reported and so are recorded. In situations where there is no Police response to a call must make further attempts as at certain times Police resources are low. Police are still looking at the parking problems. Cllr Smith advised that DCC Community Safety team had reported that there has been no significant increase in crime/ASB levels since the switch off of some street lighting. There is currently an upgrade programme for street lighting conversion to LED, and where lights were switched off will be put back on following conversion.

Borough Council: Core Strategy has been withdrawn. Raised awareness of an energy company around Somercotes, which is not a reputable company and should be reported to Trading Standards. On 4/5/6 March a National campaign is taking place 'Clean for the Queen'; all councils encouraged to take part. We need to identify a 'grot spot' area and inform AVBC. Ares will be chosen for a clean-up over those days. This Council should also get involved with the Community to clean up areas. Clerk to speak with Parish Wardens to identify areas.

County Council: Government are looking to increase Council Tax by 2% and ring fence this for Social Care Fund to generate £5m. Consultation will start next week to close 32 out of 50 children's Sure Start centres. Somercotes Sure Start will be in the consultation. Swanwick School has now been granted academisation, Somercotes Infant School is applying for academisation. DCC is in the process of closing 4 residential care homes; the process is going well, working with residents and their families. Any sales of properties will be reinvested into the existing care homes.

10/2016: Chairman's Announcements:

Members noted that the Carol Service Collection – £214.13 was raised and cheque paid to Leonard Cheshire Disability, Ripley. Members acknowledged the Note of Appreciation received from Leonard Cheshire and the Note of appreciation received from Revd. Frank Mercurio (Alfreton).

11/2016: Report of the Clerk:

(a) Village Hall:

Clerk recommends that a more robust, 'fit for purpose' disabled toilet and cistern are installed. The Council RESOLVED for three quotes to be obtained and Clerk to speak with Leonard Cheshire Disability regarding specification, providers and installers.

(b) Designs for Feature Garden:

Members noted the next meeting to meet with Groundwork (Creswell, Ashfield and Mansfield on 20th January 2016 at 5:30 pm. Groundwork will look at plot and assist with

design and installation and assist with funding bid.

(c) Allotments:

- (i) Members noted the next Allotments Committee meeting is scheduled for Friday 22nd January 2016 at 6:30 pm.
- (ii) Members noted that Sleetmoor Lane Allotments skip organised in November 15 for clear up. Cost £205.

(e) Pye Bridge Pond bench

Members noted that a Purchase Order sent to DCC in December 15 for £519.00. Installers will choose a suitable position for the bench overlooking the Pond which is easily accessible.

(f) Partnership Working with Alfreton TC:

Members noted that ATC at their December meeting Resolved to accept that the recharge rate be the same for both Councils.

(g) Pensions Automatic Enrolment: Staging date for Council is 1 August 2016. Members noted that at the March Meeting consideration and decision needs to be made on: Whether the Council will make contributions for those staff not eligible for employer contributions if they choose to join scheme.

Which contribution set is to be used for employees.

Clerk to prepare report for March meeting.

(h) Village Hall Fire Risk Assessment: Carried out by Chubb on 5th November.

Members considered the report. Question was raised as to whether ee supporting documents. Priority Recommendation which requires spend:

All fire-resisting doors require upgrade for self-closing devices.

Clerk Recommendation: remove cabin hooks from Hall & Lounge doors, fit dorguards to all fire-resisting doors. Approx £800

In addition an issue raised on annual system test; two heat detectors (entrance and kitchen) are not efficient and require upgrade to optical detectors. Approx £380

The **Council RESOLVED** for the dorguards to be fitted to all fire-resisting doors and the two detectors to be upgraded.

- (i) **Upgrade of Council Website**: Response from Swanwick Hall School not yet received. To keep on agenda due to Christmas closing of school and delayed response. Clerk to chase up.
- (j) Christmas 2015 Carol Service: Members noted that the event was very well attended and well received including the catering facilities.

The **Council RESOLVED** to keep the same format and to engage the catering company for the 2016 event. Date to be set around 12th December.

(k) Festive Lights: Contract expired after Christmas 2015.

The Council RESOLVED to put the contract out to tender to achieve Best Value.

(I) Sports Diversionary Project: Members noted that AVBC are applying for funding to continue with the Sports Diversionary Project currently run at Somerlea Centre for a further 12 months. If successful request that the Parish Council would support funding once that funding comes to an end. Chairman has written a statement in support on behalf of the Council to strengthen the bid, however, this statement does not commit to any financial contribution at this time.

The **Council RESOLVED** to release £500 for the Sports Diversionary project to Somerlea Park Centre.
