# Feature Garden Project Tell Us What You Think!


At the Parish Council Meeting on 18th March 2016, Members will agree the design for the Feature Garden project.



## Letter from your County Councillor Dear Resident

At the time of writing this letter the first round of consultation's are taking place on the proposed closure of 32 Sure Start buildings out of the 50 that Derbyshire County Council currently have. This is due to the continuing reduction in funding Derbyshire County Council is facing up to 2020. Somercotes I am sorry to say is one of those being consulted on for closure.

The consultation will last 8 weeks and you can have your say here: www.derbyshire.gov.uk/council/have\_your\_say On a positive note it has been agreed to continue supporting the local bus services up until 2017/18.

We know that this is a life line for many people and alongside the discussion to support "wheels for work" and "active travel" via community transport we are still trying to provide support to communities as best we can against a backdrop of £170 million being cut from government.

Investment in the local schools is still being made from new roofs to improvements to the nursery which will benefit all the pupils.

We are also looking to resurface further parts of the B600 on Nottingham Road this summer.

I am also asking the question as to the future of Post Offices in our communities and whether we will retain a service for the local community.

## No Increase to Parish Precept 2016-2017

Parish Councils are funded by levying a "precept" collected with the Council Tax paid by the residents of the parish.

The Parish Council at its Meeting on 16th January 2016 agreed not to increase the Parish Precept set in 2016-2017.

Through careful budget management and effective cost savings there will be no increase for this financial year.

The Parish Council employs 2 Full time staff; 3 part time staff and 3 relief staff. Responsibilities include; street cleaning; gardening and maintaining flower beds; footpath clearance; monthly waste disposal facility; two car parks; lighting columns on the Recreation Ground; 11 bus shelters; festive lighting. In addition the Council manages and maintains the Village Hall and Village Hall Bar. The Council presently provides free Poop Scoop bags and produces a quarterly Newsletter for Somercotes residents. The no increase in precept means there is no impact on the 2016-17 Band D property charge

#### 1930 Dec 12th

There was a record crowd at a Boxing tournament staged by Alfreton Sports Club in the Town Hall on Monday night. JIMMY HIGGS of Jacksdale knocked out BOY ABBOTT of Somercotes in the 3rd round, LEN GEORGE of Alfreton and YOUNG WILBRAHAM of Somercotes met in the Midlands Schoolboys Championship and GEORGE who won the title last year lost the verdict on points. JOE SMITH of South Normanton out pointed MAT BONSAL of Somercotes over 6 rounds.

#### 1932 Oct 15th

There was a good attendance of "Fans" at Alfreton on Monday night. 6 rounds TIGER SMITH of Somercotes v TIGER JOYNES of Derby. JOYNES a poor Boxer only lasted to the 2nd round when he threw in the towel.

#### 1931 July 3rd

GEORGE YATES of Leabrooks Road has been awarded a 'SUTCLIFFE BAT' for his average against EDWARDS WELFARE CC when he took 7 wickets for no runs.

#### 1931 July 3rd

SOMERCOTES CC beat BUTTERLEY by 119 to 107. Players - J SHAW, W SELLERS, P BLOUNT, H STREET, A J THOMPSON, J SELDON, J DAWES, S BRADLEY, E GUEST, G RADFORD, FRILEY.

#### 1935 May 3rd

Sunday last was an ideal day for BIRCHWOOD CYCLING CLUBs run to Newark where the Lord Mayor & Mayoress and the soldiers were parading through the town. After dinner the route was to Southwell where tea was partaken. Next Sundays run is to Loughborough with dinner at Kegworth and tea at Bunny. Leader CLARENCE WELLS.

#### 1936 April 3rd

To MR JOE DAWES the well known CUEST of Leabrooks goes the credit again of winning the Shield and Championship of the Alfreton & District Billiard League for Somercotes Billiard Hall.

#### 1936 April 3rd

Somnercotes & Dstrict Motor Cycling Club held the 1st trial run - a 30 mile competition on Sunday last. The starting point was Pentrich and finishing at the headquarters the Red Lion, Riddings. The 1st to arrive was W EXLEY riding ROYAL ENFIELD each rider had to maintain a speed of 20 miles per hour.

Bowls - Played at Somercotes on Saturday A PARRISH, E GENT, E WADDOUPS, beat the Jacksdale team 40-21.

MISS E SWINYARD of Leabrooks was named winner of the Half Mile handicap for Ladies at the Riddings Cycling & Athletics Club Sports.

My Mum; Freda Edna Culley, known as Edna, was one of these cadets training in Somercotes during 1943-1945, company 646. The following photos have been passed down to me from my Dad. My Mum worked in Cotes Park Pit canteen, where she eventually met my Dad, Raymond Henry Allen a Bevin Boy sent from Broughton in Northamptonshire during WW2.

The Girls Training Corps was set up by the board of education in 1939-1945 during WW2. On leaving school these girls were not old enough to enlist for the forces. The Girls Training Corps was a stop gap, giving them the opportunity to have a taste of military life, to experience, seemingly a mixture of Army, Navy and Air force training, preparing them for a life in the forces, also the hardship of war. When of age many of these girls moved on to join up. The objective of the training corps was to train each cadet for service to their community, both as women and citizens, also to show her the opportunities when trained; for immediate service to King and Country.

The National Association of Training Corps for Girls was formed as the umbrella organisation responsible for the GTC (Girls Training Corps) GNTC (Girls Nautical Corps) and the WJAC (Women's Junior Air Corps) later on after the war the GTC and WJAC amalgamated to become the Girls Venture Corps. The GTC was disbanded and wound up in 1948. The main reason being that after the war there seemed to be a lack of interest, need and motivation.

Their uniform consisted of Black shoes, Navy skirt, White blouse, Navy tie, GTC badge and Navy forage hat/ chip bag hat. School playgrounds became their parade ground; company 646 used Somercotes Infants School. They became proficient in marching, often displaying this on parades through the streets. Many of the groups had a Sergeant Major training them. For exercises and keep fit they had a PE Teacher. Somercotes PE Teacher was Doug Barrett, My Step mum who is now 92 remembers him well.

Typical training was on homemaking, craftsmanship, public affairs. Lectures were given by the Red Cross on home nursing, first aid, practical bed making, ambulance work, stretcher bearing and sanitation. They were also taught leadership skills, etiquette, and an insight into local government, map reading and Morse code to enable them to deliver messages on their push bikes in time of War or in the event of invasion. They were apparently even trained to fire a rifle.

There is no reason why Somercotes should not be free of dog mess (that can cause serious illness to children).

Litter is another problem that need not happen, but there is an element of many, particularly younger people who seem to think chucking down litter is normal. Keeping a clean environment is essential for future generations to be able to enjoy green space. So please put litter in the nearest litter bin or take it home.

Amber Valley Wardens have been instructed to prosecute offenders, for dog fouling & litter in public places, so you have been warned.


