## Letter from your County Councillor

**Dear Resident** 

It's that time of the year when Councils will be deciding how much the Council Tax will be deciding. This coming year, 2018/19, Derbyshire County Council's Conservative controlling group have just agreed a 4.99% increase, the highest increase in 15 years. I personally voted against this increase as I believe it will put a real burden on people just about managing and a further £12 million worth of cuts are on the way. Three examples of them are potentially no funding for crossing patrols - £300k removed, revised gritting routes -£500k removed, reduction in funding for road safety - £400k removed. Two percent of the increase is ring-fenced for adult social care. I have long said there should be a national solution to this issue.

The Tories have also increased the Council Tax by the highest in 15 years, yet they are talking about no increase in 2019/20 does this add up?

Since the last newsletter, I have been reporting various issues and helping residents, mostly about pot holes and street lighting faults - some of which I have reported more than once or even twice!! Nevertheless. I will ensure that they get repaired.

I have held surgeries with my colleagues. Councillors John McCabe and Brian Lyttle; we attended a really positive Residents' meeting at Pye Bridge. "Thank You" to the Dog & Doublet for hosting us and for the tea and coffee which was much appreciated. We are working through the issues raised with the Police and other agencies. It was agreed to be repeated in a couple of months' time.


Entitled 'That's Amore' it includes a selection of well known love songs from musicals and delightful scores. It starts at 7pm and tickets can be obtained from


The supporting artist is Brett Wales the popular organist and entertainer.

The choir rehearses each Tuesday evening in Somercotes and if any men and women are interested in joining they can contact Jen on 01773 789079. No auditions are required.






