Throughout all editions was a regular item headed: Notes, whilst not about the Somercotes area, they did affect everywhere, as most were Government edicts.

#### SOMERCOTES NEWS

#### 1940 February 2nd

Mr WALTER COOPER of Quarry Road who died June 29th 1939 left property to the value of £2,402 18s 8d. He gave £100 to Birchwood Methodist Church.

#### 1940 April 5th

Fire broke out on the roof of Leabrooks Miners Welfare on Monday night. The Butterley Company Fire Brigade with 16 Somercotes A.F.S were quickly on the scene and inside an hour had the fire under control. One auxiliary fireman was DENIS SMITH, the Derbyshire cricketer.

#### 1940 June 14th

Rev. CHARLES GORDON FROGGET former rector of Ilmington Warwickshire was inducted Vicar of Somercotes.

#### 1940 July 12th

Mr CLIFFORD NAYLOR of Quarry Road passed 1st class and 2nd class in Building Construction at the evening lectures at Nottingham University.

#### 1940 July 19th

The Rev RICHARD ERNEST BIRTWISTLE M.A. of Holmefield Road St Annes on Sea Lancashire formerly Vicar of Somercotes left £1550.

#### 1940 July 26th

Somercotes Red Cross dispatched to Bakewell a parcel containing 9 Pullovers, 7 Scarves, 1pr Bedsocks, 1pr Operation hose, 14prs Mittens (12prs given by a Sth African Lady) 73prs socks. This brings the total number of garments to 1000. £3.6s.5d was handed over by Mrs PITCHFORD and Mrs WARD a result of a Whist Drive.

#### 1944 January 14th

The Somercotes Communist Party held a one day school at Leabrooks on Sunday. Mr JACK ELEY of Nottingham gave 2 lectures on 'Economics of Capitalisation'

#### 1946 February 1st

The menfolk of St Thomas Social Club entertained the Ladies to a SUPPER & SOCIAL on Friday evening. A splendid meal prepared and served by the men. Messrs R SMITH, E GOODALL, W WYLIE, H SHARPE & EWART BETTISON presented a programme of enjoyable items.

#### 1946 April 26th

JOSEPH WILLIAM BUTLER eldest son of Mr & Mrs GEO BUTLER of Woodside Farm Ripley, married MARGARET STORER 2nd daughter of Mr & Mrs J H STORER of Birchwood Lane. Given away by her father the bride wore an ankle length dress of Ice Blue Satin with a blue veil her bouquet was of Red carnations & trailing fern.



# Letter from your County Councillor Dear Resident

Here is my latest update on things at Derbyshire County Council.

Well, it's that time of year when local authorities are setting their council tax. Derbyshire County Council have agreed a 3.99% increase for the year 2019/20, but that won't mean services won't continue to be cut. I use the word cut because the controlling conservative group insist on referring to them as efficiency savings.

£90 million of cuts have taken place since austerity began in 2010 – we were all told it would last for 5 years. Nine years later it is still with us and services like Learning Disability Day Care is now subject to a consultation on closing a number of facilities – Parkwood being one of them.

Youth clubs are being closed down throughout Derbyshire and support for vulnerable children is being removed. This is called the Early Help Offer. So much for not making our children pay.

The library consultation has just been completed where they were gauging views on community groups taking them over. Of the 20 libraries consulted on, only one had any interest shown in a group taking it over. What happens next to Somercotes Library and the others.

Locally I have been reporting light outages throughout the community because the night patroller is no longer funded, so it falls down to us to report faults to Derbyshire County Council.

I have asked for various roads and pavements to be considered for resurfacing. This depends on the council's budget and priorities for spending. The government have given £8.6 million one-off funding for highways which needs to be spent by 31 March 2019. We will see how much of this comes to this area. I have, over the months, supported many organisations with grants from the Derbyshire County Council Community Priority Funding which helps support the valuable work in the community continue.

### TRAFFIC LIGHTS / ROAD CLOSURES

We seem to be inundated with road closures at the moment due to water and electricity faults. For the people who use Sleetmoor Lane as a route, the traffic lights and signage have been installed at this location due to the continuing problem with water seeping onto the road and it freezing causing a highway safety issue. Meetings and exploratory excavations have taken place to resolve this problem and a scheme is being programmed to resolve it by Derbyshire County Council and Severn Trent. Councillor Steve Marshall-Clarke and I are both pursuing a solution to this.


For bus users it's great that we are in the 21st century with some stops having the next time display installed – it saves having to carry a torch to read and try and understand the bus timetables.

# A NEW FLAT GREEN BOWLING CLUB IS JUST STARTING UP AT THE SOMERLEA CENTRE IN SOMERCOTES

Whatever your age and whether you are a novice or an experienced bowler looking to join a brand new bowls club just starting up, then the Phoenix outdoor flat green bowling club at the Somerlea Centre in Somercotes, is the place for you.

Membership for the 2019 season is just £10 per member. You may be wondering why the membership is so low, when other club in the area or charging £50 / £60 to each member. This is because we are only just starting up and too late to join any competitive bowling leagues this year. All Bowls club usually fix all their league matches in the month of February for that season, and that is the only reason why our fees are £10 this year. We will always fight in our clubs corner to ensure that our membership fees are the lowest in the area over the coming years.

This year we are in essence only a social bowling club seeking new members which make this club ideal if you are just starting out in the great game of bowls because there is no pressure on you. Just the pure pleasures of outdoor bowls on a sunny day relaxing on the green with family and friends, having a laugh and learning about the great game of bowls at the same time.

We will of course hold our own club rollup days at least once a week or more if possible, with tea and biscuits. It's a good time to socialise and have a laugh, we will also have our own internal matches and invite other clubs to come and give us a friendly game which is a little more competitive. Again another great way to learn the game on a more competitive level and make new friends at the same time. All new and old members will be made very welcome at the Phoenix Bowls Club at the Somerlea Centre in Somercotes.

If you are an existing member of a bowls club and play in their leagues, you could still come and join us for just £10 per season and play for 22 weeks this year. This is equivalent to just 45 pence per week and you would not affect your membership or ability to play for your home club in their league matches, because our club is not affiliated to any leagues, and we do not play in any leagues matches at this time. We will be seeking membership into the leagues next year if we attain the required numbers of members this year.

If you love the game as we do, come and help new players get a good grounding and understanding of the joy and friendship there is in the great game of bowls. Come and help build The Phoenix Bowls Club at the Somerlea Centre in Somercotes into a club that respects and encourages its members to submit ideas and suggestions for making this club the best club to join.

All members of The Phoenix Bowls Club at the Somerlea Centre in Somercotes can play on the green 7 days a week from 11a.m. until dusk each day, from mid-April till mid-September each year and there are six rinks on the green. Members will be able to acquire their own key to access welfare facilities at the centre.

The exhibition displayed newspapers, letters and other memorabilia from that time. Many local organisations contributed, bringing a very local perspective to the event.


On the 11th November a beacon was lit outside the Village Hall as Somercotes took part in the national 'Beacons of Light' event.


