A surprise visitor this year was Father Christmas, who distributed selection boxes to the children.




Finally, as we begin another year, I cannot do so without expressing my great sadness at the passing of my friend and colleague, Cllr Brian Lyttle in December.

One memory I have of Brian is how he got his dog Sadie. I had a call one Saturday afternoon from my Sister in Law to say she had found a dog on her drive under her car. At that time there was no dog warden till Monday morning so I rang Brian and Carol to see if they could look after it till Monday morning. The dog warden then asked him if he could look after it till the owner was found. The owner was never found, Brian and Carol kept the dog! This is just one example of how caring Brian was.

Myself and Paul Smith will miss Brian deeply. We have lost a comrade, friend and a brother. We will miss his dry sense humour, his wise words and his friendship. It has been an honour to be Brian's friend.

On a couple of occasions I joined in with him at the Crown on Sleetmoor Lane but he soon realised I wasn't that good so he didn't bother asking me again!

The Derbyshire County Council tax bill will go up by 2% this financial year and will appear on your bill as Adult Social Care precept. Even though the Conservative administration have been saying for the last two years that they would deliver a zero council tax increase.

There is also a consultation ongoing with a proposal to close seven of the County Council's residential care homes over the next two years; they are arguing the homes are not fit for purpose and there will be no need for them in the future. But most of the current residents residing in the homes proposed for closure will be accommodated by the private sector!!

All the Youth Work buildings have now ceased to provide facilities for young people and most of the youth workers have been made redundant. All the buildings are being declared as surplus to requirements and will be disposed of, so young people will have less on offer to them throughout Derbyshire. The future of the Somercotes Youth Club building is something I am asking questions about.

I have been reporting potholes throughout the area and the condition of the roads which came out in a residents' satisfaction survey as being poor and the state of Derbyshire roads being of the most concern to residents. This is after the Conservative administration have said there is a 80% improvement in pothole filling under their administration. Look at the gulley opposite Archway Interiors which I reported 3 months ago.

The LED lighting programme is coming to this area this financial year but in the meantime because the Council have not got any night light patrollers they rely on you and me to report the lights out, which I am constantly doing but it is now taking up to 2 months for a repair.

Can I inform you that we are in the hands of Western Power in regards to the bank of street lights out at Lower Somercotes? They have attended to the lights, put in a larger fuse which worked for 48 hours and they now have to re-cable the columns. Whilst they are doing this I have asked Derbyshire County Council to renew all the lighting heads with LED which they have agreed to do. I am told the work will be carried out at the end of February – I can then file all my emails I have sent on the subject!

Throughout all editions was a regular item headed: Notes, whilst not about the Somercotes area, they did affect everywhere, as most were Government edicts.

BITS & BOBS FROM THE NEWSPAPERS

1925 Jan 30th. Last weekend a horse attached to a dray belonging to Mr THOMAS FOX of Leabrooks sliped near the VICTORIA HOTEL Leabrooks bolted and came into a collision with a lamp post. Owing to the smooth surface of the road 5 horses are known to have been down in one week.

1927 Mar 25th. WILLIAM HOLDING aged 5 of the council houses SOMERCOTES was accidentally shot in the eye while he and a friend were playing with toy BOWS & ARROWS. The boy was conveyed to DRI where it was necessary to remove the eye.

1928 Aug 28th. On Thursday last ROBERT HUCKERBY 66 a retired miner of 19 Cermetery Rd and CATHERINE MARSHALL of Swanwick an ELDERLY COURTING COUPLE were knocked down by CHARLES EDWARD SMITH who was motorcycling home to Alfreton. They were conveyed to Chesterfield Hospital where the man died shortly after admission, the woman is on the road to recovery.

1930 Oct 24. As the NEW ACT will become effective on Jan 1st 1931 and the premiums will fluctuate, get your VEHICLE INSURED before that date. Fully Comprehensive 8HP cars £6.15s.

MORRIS COWLEY £9.00, NEW FORDS £11.00.

1931 Nov 13th. A very successful MENS ARMISTICE SERVICE was held in the Parish Church Somercotes. The Rev Dr IRWIN Vicar of Duffield was the Preacher. On Tuesday evening there was a service of WOMEN, the Rev P A SHARP Vicar of Selston preached. Offertories at both services were for the DRI.

1934 May 3rd. Premier Somercotes. A thrilling drama "YELLOW COMMUNIST RISINGS" will be screened on the 1st 3 days. Next week starring SPENCER TRACY in "SHANGHI MADNESS"


1934 Jun 14th. Mr THOMAS PARKIN of Lorne House Charles St Leabrooks, Joint Principal of Messrs TAYLOR & PARKIN Builders & Cointractors of Leabrooks who died Oct 6th aged 65 left Estate to the gross value of £2025.44 net £1524.64. Probate granted to JOHN WM BOWER of Swanwick & WM PARKIN Junior of Riddings.

1940 Feb 2nd. At Alfreton Petty Sessions on Wednesday PERCY RYLE 58 Licensee of the BLACK HORSE INN Lower Somercotes was summoned for selling intoxicating liquor during non permitted hours on CHRISTMAS DAY. His daughter Miss IRIS RYLE 27 barmaid was summoned for aiding and abetting, and FRANK DICKENS 32 OF Littlemore Newton was summoned for consuming the liquor.

1934 Apr 26th. In accordance with our ANNUAL CUSTOM we beg to announce that the CUCKOO made its appearance at Alfreton on April 20th. It was heard warbling in POND WOOD. This will probably cause an official inquiry as the CUCKOO is not supposed to start its performance until the GOVERNMENTS SCHEDULE SUMMERTIME is in operation. The CUCKOOS excuse will be that the best of governments are unable to GOVERN THE WEATHER.

Community Transport for Town & County (CT4TC) started life over 30 years ago as Amber Valley Community Transport in Ripley, merging with Chesterfield & District Community Transport in 2010 to become CT4TC and now in the process of re-branding to Derbyshire Community Transport.

FOR TOWN & COUNTY

In April 2018 we became part of HCT Group, a large scale Social Enterprise and a provider of Community Transport services all over the country.

Since October 2017 we have been operating the Derbyshire Connect (Shopping Bus) service on behalf of Derbyshire County Council in the Amber Valley, Chesterfield, North East Derbyshire, Bolsover and Erewash areas.

Derbyshire Connect is a bookable door to door shopping bus service for people who are unable to use conventional buses because of mobility difficulties or because they live in areas with limited bus services.

The Derbyshire Connect service provides a once a week service to a local town centre or supermarket. The day and time of the trip is advised upon registration and booking.

The REALLY good news is this service is completely FREE OF CHARGE for Gold Card (Bus Pass) holders.

Lunch Club outings operate once every 3 weeks and Day Out Trips once a month.


