Councillor Jim Spibey passed away on 26th December, 2011, and will be greatly missed by all who knew him. He had celebrated his 80th birthday in August 2011. Jim was a Parish Councillor for 25 years and always took a great interest in the parish. He represented the Parish Council at the unveiling of the Sherwood Foresters Western Front Memorial at Ypres in Belgium in October 2009, making the journey with his daughter, Elaine, at his own expense.

Jim was a keen and knowledgeable gardener, and his garden always looked beautiful. He also loved growing his own vegetables as he always said they taste so much better. He enjoyed visiting the Shrewsbury and Harrogate flower shows, and he visited Shrewsbury with family and friends last year.

Jim was born in Alfreton and became a milkman after leaving school aged 14, and then started working for British Railways and became an engine driver, driving steam trains at first, then diesel engines. He was called up to do his National Service in Cologne, Germany, serving in the Royal Medical Corps, and on completion of his service he returned to the railway until his retirement.

He married Hilda Bumham of Somercotes and they were married for 55 years until Hilda's death in February 2008. In later years, Jim and Hilda became keen ballroom dancers, and spent a great deal of time at dances, and also practising at home. Jim continued dancing after Hilda's death, right up until his illness.

Jim leaves a daughter, Elaine and her husband Steve, and their daughter, Leanne, who was married on 14th January to Dave. He also leaves a son, David, and his wife Sue.

Elaine told us that "Dad was always on the go, gardening, dancing, cooking, baking cakes, and his famous coconut tarts and beetroot chutney. He loved to spend time at Whitby with the family and especially walking on the beach with Maddie, our shared family dog.

He enjoyed watching sport, mainly football, aricket, darts and snooker. He was interested in wild life and history programmes, and could converse on most subjects. He was very well travelled, having spent holidays in Germany, Italy and Austria to name but a few. He supported charities, and donations of £867 have been sent to the Air Ambulance in lieu of flowers, as he had requested. He was thoughtful, kind, and a true gentleman, and I was proud to have him as my father".

Former Residents of Somercotes

Eric Shepherd – Artist

Eric was born in Somercotes in 1935 and told us he has fond memories of the area. Eric's father, George, was a coal miner at Moorwoods coal mine, and was also a well-known billiard player who won the Amateur Billiard Championship. Eric was one of 9 children, the others being Richard, Jack Kenneth, Clifford, Brian, Betty, Jean and Pat, who died when she was 9 months old). Eric also has a vivid memory of his sister Betty being killed by, to quote Eric "what must have been the only car on the road", when she was 3 years old while she was listening to the service at the Chapel opposite Annie Mason's fish and chip shop on Somercotes Hill. Eric saw it happen as he waited in the queue for his order. He tells us there were very few cars on the road in those days, just horses and carts delivering the milk and fresh vegetables to people's doors. One of Eric's favourite places was Pennytown, where he remembers fishing, swimming, bird watching, or playing on the disused army tanks and lorries. He said he and his friends even took a few apples from the allotments on their way down! He told us the Somercotes fair, which was held on the recreation ground, was always an exciting time, with the big steam engines generating the electricity

Eric has a strange story to tell about walking through the churchyard with his friend, Roy Green, after a Saturday matinee at the Empire. Eric was always fascinated by the graves in those days, with glo domes encasing porcelain flowers. They came upon a newly dug grave. The flowers were almost dead, and they knelt alongside the grave to read the little tags on the wreaths, etc. Eric says that "out of this grave rose a thick mist of gold, a bit like thick fog, but very golden. It was about 12" high by the length of the grave. We watched as it rose higher and higher, passing through the branches of a nearby tree, until it went out of sight. Neither of us were frightened. We told our parents and teachers but no-one wanted to believe us, but we both knew what we had seen, and I will carry that memory to my grave". Eric worked as the sole sign artist for Kimberley Ales in Eastwood, then later went to work for Midland Drapery. He spent his evenings painting portrait commissions of local dignitaries. 18 years later Eric went to work in Florida, USA, producing murals for the film industry, and it was during this time he decided to concentrate solely on wildlife painting and on arriving in Australia in 1980 he became a member of the Wildlife Art Society of Australasia, where he received many of the top awards in their annual wildlife shows. Eric has two sons, Austin and Matthew. Eric's brother, Clifford, lives at Heanor, and his sister, Jean, still lives in Somercotes.





DERBYSHIRE ANCESTRAL RESEARCH GROUP

Margaret Brooksbank of Derbyshire Ancestral Research Group asks:

DID YOU KNOW?

The earliest mention of SUMCOT occurred in 1225.

In 1549 the Crown sold "a message in SOMERCOTES in the tenure of THOMAS BLAND to THOMAS BABINGTON" Lord of the Manor.

In 1801 the Parish Workhouse was built on Sleetmoor Lane and closed in 1840. It was converted into the Laburnam Inn and demolished in 1964.

In 1847 JOHN COUPLAND of Lincolnshire bought land on Birchwood Lane and opened mines.

Around 1870 THOMAS COUPLAND, his son, bought land at Upper Somercotes and erected houses in COUPLAND PLACE for his workers. In the 1881 census there were 79 houses in COUPLAND PLACE and 51 housed people from outside the Parish.

In 1893 the Trustees of the MOREWOOD CHARITY sold the "DRUNKEN CLOSES" to Alfreton Urban District Council who laid out LEABROOKS CEMETERY.

The first person to be buried there was JAMES KNOWLES of July 12 1895 aged 55 years

In 1904 there were 7 Farmers, 8 Butchers, 4 Fried Fish dealers, 1 Pawnbroker and 1 Vocalist among the people living in Somercotes.

In 1910 MR LLOYD GEORGE came to Somercotes. A huge tent was erected up in the Market Place for the 5000 expected, but only when a Showman who rented the area had moved all his machinery.

MRS W MEADOWS lost her mother, two sisters, a brother-in-law and two nieces in the LUSITANIA DISASTER of 1915.

In 1917 the PREMIER ELECTRIC THEATRE had five different acts every day plus Topical War news. Tuesday mornings at 10.30 were Men's special matinees.

It was reported in 1918 that "Pupils from the Girls school have collected 9777 eggs over the last 3 years for the wounded soldiers".

In 1969 the bypass on Nix's Hill was opened by Mr Brown MP. The cavalcade was led by Chitty Chitty Bang Bang.

The "Department of the Environment building or suchlike of Historical Interest" – the only thing that qualified for the above was the Mile Post on Somercotes Hill! Date uncertain.

Thanks to Residents for Information on Somercotes Guisers

In the last issue of the newsletter we asked if anyone remembered the Somercotes Guisers.

Our thanks to Mrs Waring, Mrs Jean Armstrong, Mr Ron Waller, and Parish Councillor Alan Stringer, who all contacted us with their memories.

Mrs Jean Armstrong remembers her brother, Len Waller, being in the Guisers in the 1930's. Alan Stringer's brother, Des, was also one of the original members, and Alan told us that there were a few "incarnations" of the Guisers – they would disband, then others would start up later, and his brother, Charlie was one of the later Guisers. Alan was also able to recite from memory most of the words of the play they would perform, as found on the internet. The characters included William the Great, St. George, Bull Slasher/Jack, Doctor and Beelzebub.

Mrs Waring told us her brothers, Norman and Alan Kerry, were both members of the Guisers in the 1940's, along with Eric Barker, Tony Hunt, Charlie Stringer and Alan Cockayne. She remembers that the Guisers would "black-up" using soot from the chimney, dress up and go around pubs performing, or into people's homes. She said they were very popular and people would put money into a cap.

Ron Waller also remembers the Guisers going into the public houses, and said they would be invited into people's homes to perform. Though only a child at the time, he remembers people putting money into a tin. He remembers seeing a performance at The Seven Stars at Riddings.

Letter from your County Councillor

Firstly, I would like to let you know that after discussions held at Matlock regarding the at risk school bus service from Pyebridge to Swarnwick Hall School, Freeway Coaches have agreed to continue the service from April 2012 without any subsidy. The timetable will remain the same but because of the subsidy removal the fares will have to be increased. I believe the school is aware of this and updated letters will be provided to the school shortly and in turn the information will be passed on to parents. I have asked Derbyshire County Council to seriously consider resurfacing Somercotes Hill through to Pyebridge and also High Street through to Leabrooks (Devonshire Drive). These roads are generating a lot of noise due to their poor condition through the amount of HGV traffic accessing the Industrial Estates via these roads. If you would like to contact Derbyshire County Council direct to raise your concerns, please do so by telephoning "Call Derbyshire" on 08456 058 058.

There is another consultation taking place regarding the Youth Service. The current County Council administration is proposing to dispose of or sell the youth dub buildings and they will not be providing direct building based youth work. They believe the community and volunteers can provide this professional service by bidding for money from a reduced budget that is available. Please also consider filling in the on-line petition which can be accessed by the link above. Already hundreds of young people have signed the petition against these changes as they see them as an attack on a highly valued service. Please don't just let it happen. There will be a paper petition available for signing in the Parish Council Office and at Somerlea Park Centre.

Regarding the pedestrian refuge at Hoddey Way near MacDonalds, it is being preconstructed then will be bolted to the road so if it is becoming overrun by heavy goods vehicles they can reposition it if needed.

£6,000 has been provided for improvement to the street lighting scheme on Spencer Drive, and there is a additional £38,000 for Windmill Rise, from Parkside to the junction of Spencer Drive

Father Peter writes:-

"My Dear Friends,

It is with much joy that I begin my ministry as the new Vicar of the Benefice of Somercotes, St. Thomas. Joy, because I am presented with a wonderful opportunity to share God's passion for the world through the Good News of Jesus Christ in a new setting with new people!

I am 60, married to Susan. We have three grown children—Lisa, Laura and Andrew. In addition, Sue and I have three wonderful grandchildren, Owen, Ethan and Evalyn (there is a new one on the way!). We also have a Jack Russell called Jasper. My interests include travelling, listening to music, painting, fishing, coaching rugby and Early Christian and Byzantine Art. Susan enjoys travelling, gardening, dancing and reading. I have a BD (Hons), MA in Pastoral Theology, PGCE(Sec), PGCE (post-16) and a Cert.Th.





Motor Cyclist using Footpaths & Bridleways - 'Don't break the Law'

The Council has received complaints that motorcycles are being ridden along footpaths, bridleways and around Pennytown Ponds.

S34, Road Traffic Act 1988, prohibits the driving of mechanically propelled vehicles elsewhere than on roads.

1) Subject to the provisions of this section, if without lawful authority a person drives a mechanically propelled vehicle -

(a) on to or upon any common land, moorland or land of any other description, not being land forming part of a road, or

(b) on any road being a footpath, bridleway or restricted byway, he is guilty of an offence.

Please respect the law and the safety of those using footpaths and bridleways or other places of leisure.

At the Parish Council Meeting, 20th January 2012, the Police reported that there had been a reduction in the number of burglaries in Somercotes.
