Throughout all editions was a regular item headed: Notes, whilst not about the Somercotes area, they did affect everywhere, as most were Government edicts.

The Derbyshire Ancestral Research Group is very pleased to say that we are now open for visitors. We meet in Birchwood Methodist Church school room each Wednesday from 9.30am until 1pm. All welcome.

1930 Notes: Alfreton Urban District Council at the meeting on Tuesday considered the age of their workmen and after a long discussion it was agreed to give 3 months notice to all employees over the age of 70 and to intimate to all workmen that at 70 years they will be compulsory retired.

1930 July 4th. The latest is the installation of TALKIES a the EMPIRE. The first performance being on Monday last. There were two crowded houses. It is evident that TALKIES are here to stay.

1930 July 11th. The RECREATION GROUND on Victoria Street has been very popular this week. 100s of children and parents have visited the ground in which the Urban Council have made a PADDLING POOL & SAND PIT. Better behaviour is necessary from the BIGGER BOYS

1931 Health Notes. For TORRID DREAM & NERVOUSNESS take BROM-BARK for a few weeks in moderate doses. You must get out of doors daily, games, walks or best of all DIGGING.

Also HORSEBACK RIDING are the best for nerves.

COLD BATHS are good for those who enjoy them and bad for those who don't

1932 When a man is MARRIED his APPETITE grows or so his wife always finds but that's because she treats him so well. Give him plenty of PUDDINGS made with ATORA the good BEEF SUET.

1932 Oct 21st. A full time CARETAKER is required for SOMERCOTES CENTRAL SCHOOL. Wages £2.10s.0d a week less temporary reduction. The post will be pensionable and applicants will be required to pass a medical. Applicants must not be more than 45 years of age.

1934 April 26th. Following a fall in the street the previous Tuesday night the death took place on Sunday evening of MR ALFRED BAKEWELL, Baker & Confectioner of Leabrooks Road Somercotes.

1934 May 3rd. Alfreton Urban Council MR LEE moved: "That the Councils playing field be opened for playing games on Sundays". Mr Lee said times were altered since 50 years ago when he used to go to SUNDAY SCHOOL and would be sent to HELL when he had a slide on Sunday. This was supported by Church people and Catholics if played after Church.

1935 May 9th. Somercotes JUBILEE CELEBRATIONS were not of an ambitious character there being no special arrangements. Tea was provided for the children in various schoolrooms and sports events held for infants on the recreation ground. Souvenir beakers were presented to the children and new FLORINS to the OLD AGE PENSIONERS. There was no evening entertainment.

Chernobyl Children Life Line

(Pinxton & East Derbyshire Link)
Autumn update

Sadly over the past 18 months, we have not been able to continue bringing the children affected by the nuclear disaster at Chernobyl, for convalescing due to the covid pandemic. The past two years have been terrible for everyone around the world with the covid pandemic ruthlessly upsetting and sometimes destroying family lives. We are lucky in many ways living in the UK and despite all the criticisms of how it was managed we have fared much better than many other countries. None more so than Belarus who was the worst affected country following the Chernobyl nuclear disaster. From the on start of covid, their government went into denial saying that covid didn't exist in Belarus and people should

carry on as normal. They gave no help to the hospitals and clinics to deal with the pandemic and it was thanks to groups and charities such as us providing ongoing support to help bring some control to the pandemic. Had their government acknowledged covid and signed up for Covix they would have got international help with equipment and PPE, along with the provision of the vaccine. It really is a terrible time for everyone especially all our children and friends in Belarus who desperately need our help.

Because of the Covid situation, hopefully people around the world will now understand more about the problems that came from the Chernobyl nuclear disaster as the Covid-19 pandemic showed us all how difficult it is to fight something that you can't see, smell or touch and how worrying long-term health consequences could be as a result. The victims of the Chernobyl disaster not only suffer from long term health problems but also the mental stress and pressure in their fight for survival. Imagine living with this for 35 years and raising a family in such circumstances. Most of us need certainty and hope that our troubles will soon be over, and the right solution is around the corner. This is a normal emotion, along with the need to know that our children and loved ones are healthy and well. The Chernobyl disaster was bad enough but the covid - 19 on top of that just made things much worse. This, along with the political problems they are currently enduring makes life very difficult. What have we been doing to help?

Throughout the pandemic we have been constantly giving support wherever we can, however we can in the hospitals, clinics and within the community our children live in. We have continued to do some fundraising where possible and thanks to our dear friends and supporters continuing their invaluable support, we are able to do what we can and maintain some hope in everyone's lives. Never has our help been needed so much and everyone is so grateful for the help we have been able to give.

We remain committed to helping the children of Belarus and intend to resume visits asap. Please recall they were already in great difficulty with the after effects of the nuclear disaster, let alone these problems being compounded with issues from covid and the political problems. Remember any sanctions put on the country have the least affect on the corrupt leaders at the top yet a devastating effect on the countries ordinary citizens who are already suffering the costs of high inflation, high prices, low salaries and poor health. The country has no valuable natural resources or fossil fuels so is of little interest or value to anyone except Russia who want the country as a defensive barrier between Europe and Russia. The people are oppressed and desperately in much need of help from outside and the international community. We will continue to strive and support the children however we can, in the hope of helping them through these very difficult times and for a better future ahead. The children and their families will not be forgotten while ever we are able to provide help to them and hope that you too may be able to offer your great help to us in all we do. Despite the children's visit being deferred, here in the UK we are gradually winning the fight against covid and hopefully political changes will soon take place in Belarus that will ease the pressures currently imposed. As a linkwe still remain active in what we are doing, and we are still out and about where we can with our fundraising and continue to plan for the next children's visit and raise the necessary funds to bring the children. Covid and the political unrest have been our main enemies over the past 2 years affecting everyone. We have continued with our fundraising wherever we can throughout and started our post covid fundraising with two successful events in September at Leabrooks and Pinxton. As mentioned earlier our priority as always is the children's visits but when no visits were possible we diverted our support to deal primarily with the covid pandemic in Belarus but have also given some support in other areas. There has also been some personal support from members and friends of the Link. As we venture out of covid we will now need to concentrate our resources and fundraising for the next visit as there is an expected increase in travel costs anticipated if things remain as they are. This is primarily due to the increased administration of documents, possible covid tests, increased visa cost and increased / extra flight costs. At the moment Belavia flights are suspended over Europe which is due for a review sometime in October. We hope this review eventually leads to allowing direct passenger travel to resume.

To enable us to give these children this wonderful opportunity in their lives the Chernobyl Children Life Line needs to find more volunteer host families who are able to open their hearts and their homes to give these unfortunate children, their opportunity of a lifetime. Our group consists of very ordinary people from different backgrounds and you don't have to be different, special or wealthy to host these unfortunate children or to help in some other way. The visiting children are various ages and are boys or girls to fit in with the family circumstances and each group is accompanied with a competent leader / translator in the event of any language difficulties. The whole experience is morally very rewarding and enjoyable for all those who take part. So if you think you would like to get involved with the local link, could offer a child the opportunity of a lifetime and enjoy yourself at the same time why not consider hosting a child when the visits resume.
